Why do we sing a phrase over and over again?

- Revelation 4:8

- The absence of repetition leaves worship simply in the mind. Without repetition our minds keep racing to grasp the next idea or thought in the song. Great worship songs & worship leaders have a mix of new thoughts and repetition.
